When doing so, tweets are available to any internet user in the world, not just those who follow the poster. There is also no way to tell who has seen your tweet.

With this in mind, there is a variety of privacy settings that you can chose to use to minimize visibility or sharing of information.


We have illustrated a complete walk-through to controlling these privacy settings. You can jump to individual sections or review the entire thing.

NOTE: Since each device's interface is different, we have used images from the desktop version of Twitter. This said, we highly recommend you use the desktop version to update settings because they are easier to access and have more options.

To access the privacy settings for Twitter, select your avatar (profile picture) and pull down the menu to Settings and Privacy.





The *Privacy and Safety* options (as seen below) contain four areas that limit what information can be shared and accessed by others: Tweet Privacy, Tweet Location, Photo Tagging, and Discoverability.
